Students will work on economic texts from scientific books, articles from economic newspapers and magazines. By working on these texts they become familiar with economic terminology and are able to make presentations, participate in discussions on the following topics: Economic cycle, sectors of the economy, market - supply and demand, forms of markets, economic indicators, phases of the economy, economic policy objectives, unemployment (causes, consequences, countermeasures), forms of employment, inflation, recession and inflation crises, structural crises, export trade.

The course requires a minimum language proficiency level of B2 in German.
