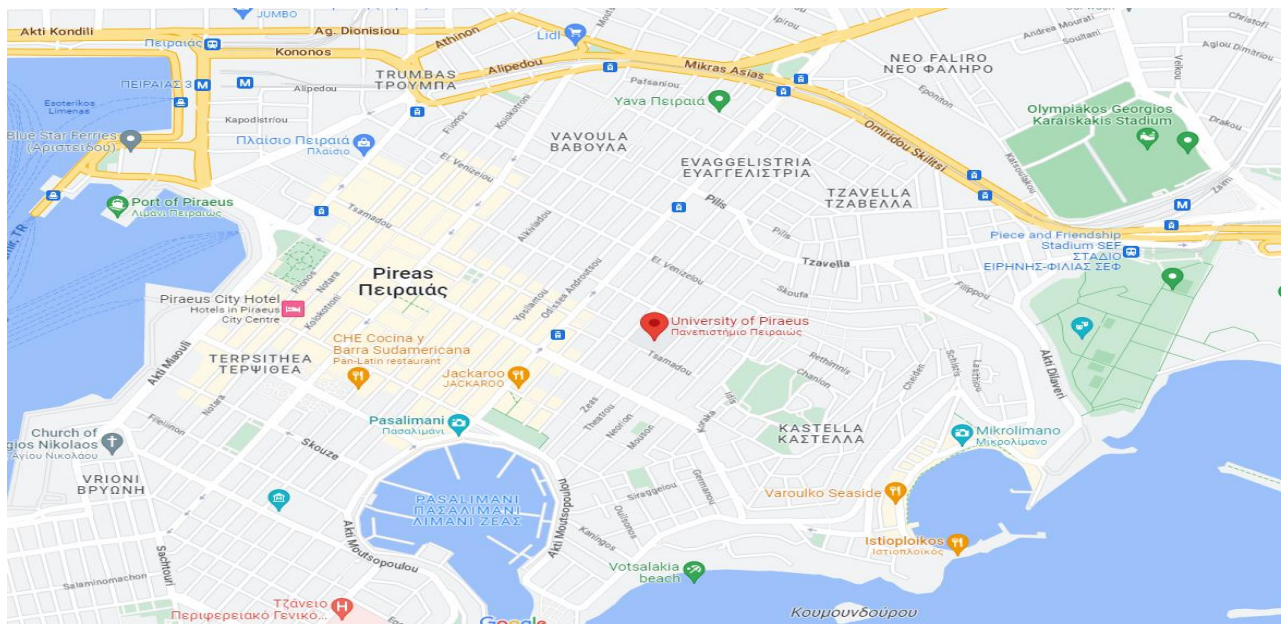

## HISTORY

### THE NAME

It is widely known that the name "Piraeus" comes from the word *beyond/peran*, in the sense of distant or opposite land. According to others, the name comes from the word *by pass/diaperan*, or *beyond I flow/peran reo* and the verb *I'm leaving/peraio*, which means *pass through, i.e./carry over* someone to the other side, because in ancient times there was a marshy area in between the two lands, the so-called "Alipedon", in the area where Faliro is located today. However, as the geological researches have shown, Piraeus was actually an island. It united with the

coast of Attica during the Quaternary Period, due to the siltation of the river Kifisos where today Moschato and Faliron Delta are situated.

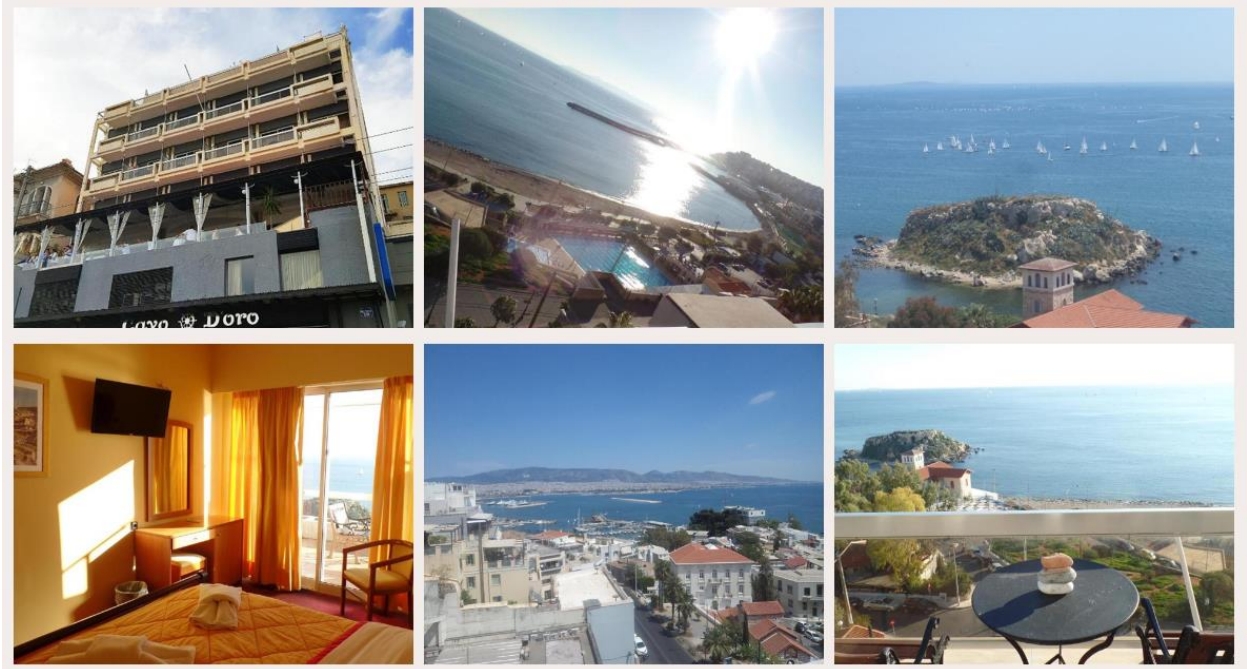
